NC DKG Scholarships and DKG Scholarships Due February 1 There will be two Doctoral scholarships and one Post-Baccalaureate scholarship available this year through NC DKG. Scholarship applications are due by February 1, 2023. The NCDKG scholarship forms are linked on the state website, along with an applicant checklist. NC DKG members may apply for both an NC DKG and an international scholarship within a given year. The membership requirement for International applicants is three years and for NC DKG applicants is two calendar years following induction. The international forms are available under the Apply/Submit tab of the DKG member website.

Fresh Apple Cake

1 ½ c Wesson Oil 2 c Sugar 3 c Fresh Apples (chopped)
3 Eggs 1 t Baking Powder 1 c Pecans
3 c Self Rising King Arthur Flour 2 t Vanilla

Glaze Mix
¼ c Milk
1 c Brown Sugar
½ c Margarine

Mix Wesson oil, sugar, and vanilla. In another bowl mix dry ingredients. To Wesson oil mixture add 1/3 dry ingredients, then one egg and repeat until all ingredients are mixed. Then add apples and nuts.
Bake in a 9x13 inch pan in a 350 degrees oven for 1 hour 15 minutes.
Mix all ingredients for the glaze mix, bring to a boil, then pour over cake. Let set at least one hour.

Decorate with sugared apples and pecans.

Caramel Apple Dip

2 (8oz) Blocks of Cream Cheese
1 c Sugar
1 Bowl of Marzetti Caramel Dip
3 Heath Candy Bars Chopped (Toffee Bar covered in Chocolate)
8-10 Granny Smith Apples

Mix room temperature Cream Cheese with sugar. Spread in jelly roll pan and refrigerate till stiff. Top with room temperature caramel dip; cream cheese has to be cold so caramel does not mix but will remain on top. Sprinkle chopped Heath candy bars on top of mixture. Cut apples in wedges and dip into Caramel Apple Dip.
