Program Project and Activity Ideas

- 1. One chapter invited the head of the oncology department at local hospital to talk about breast and ovarian cancer since they have higher than normal rates of the diseases in their community. Chapters also host presentations held in conjunction with minihealth fairs with blood pressure, blood sugar and susceptibility checks for osteoporosis.
- 2. Dinner and a workshop making holiday cards with women from a local home transitioning from incarceration to community living was a special meeting for a chapter before the holidays.
- 3. Chapter provides program for teen moms where they provide books and training to read to their toddlers and the need for early reading; over 100 teen moms are in this program.
- 4. Pearl Projects chapter members bring items monthly to donate to local organizations including a welcome gift for new teachers, books for newborns, monetary support for mammograms, items for homeless shelters and shelters for abused women.
- 5. Cinderella's Closet is the project of one chapter Girls from local high schools have the opportunity to select prom dresses and accessories.

Isaiah 41:10 King James Version (KJV)

10 Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness.

I have heard it said there are 365 references to "fear not" in the Bible. I know there are at least 355, according to Dake's Annotated Reference Bible, one "fear not" for almost every day of the year.

Do you really want to obey the scriptures and "fear not"? If so, you will be in good company because every person in the Bible who was ever used by God to any degree was told over and over by Him, "Fear not."

Recipe Corner

Grilled Corn with Cilantro-Lime Butter



Ingredients

½ cup butter, softened ¼ cup fresh cilantro, chopped 1 Tablespoon fresh lime juice 1 teaspoon grated lime peel 10 medium ears sweet corn, husks removed Cotija cheese, grated (optional)

Instructions

In a small bowl mix butter, cilantro, lime juice and peel. Cover tightly with plastic wrap and chill in refrigerator 30 minutes or until ready to use.

Grill corn over medium heat, turning occasionally, until speckled with char spots and tender (about 15 to 20 minutes.)

Carefully remove corn from grill and serve with butter and grated cheese, if desired. Enjoy!
